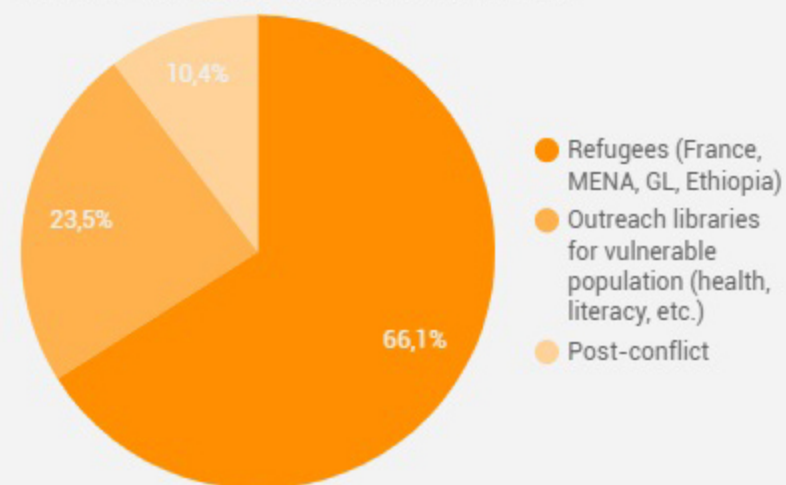

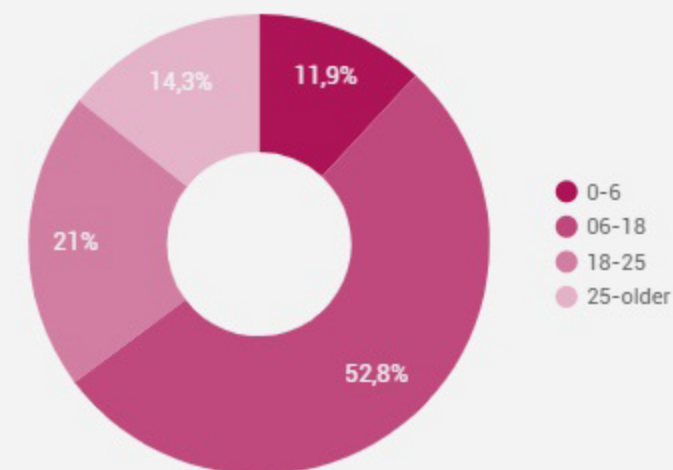

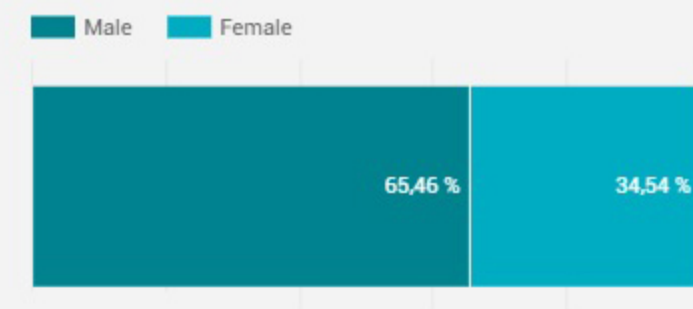
AGE GROUPS



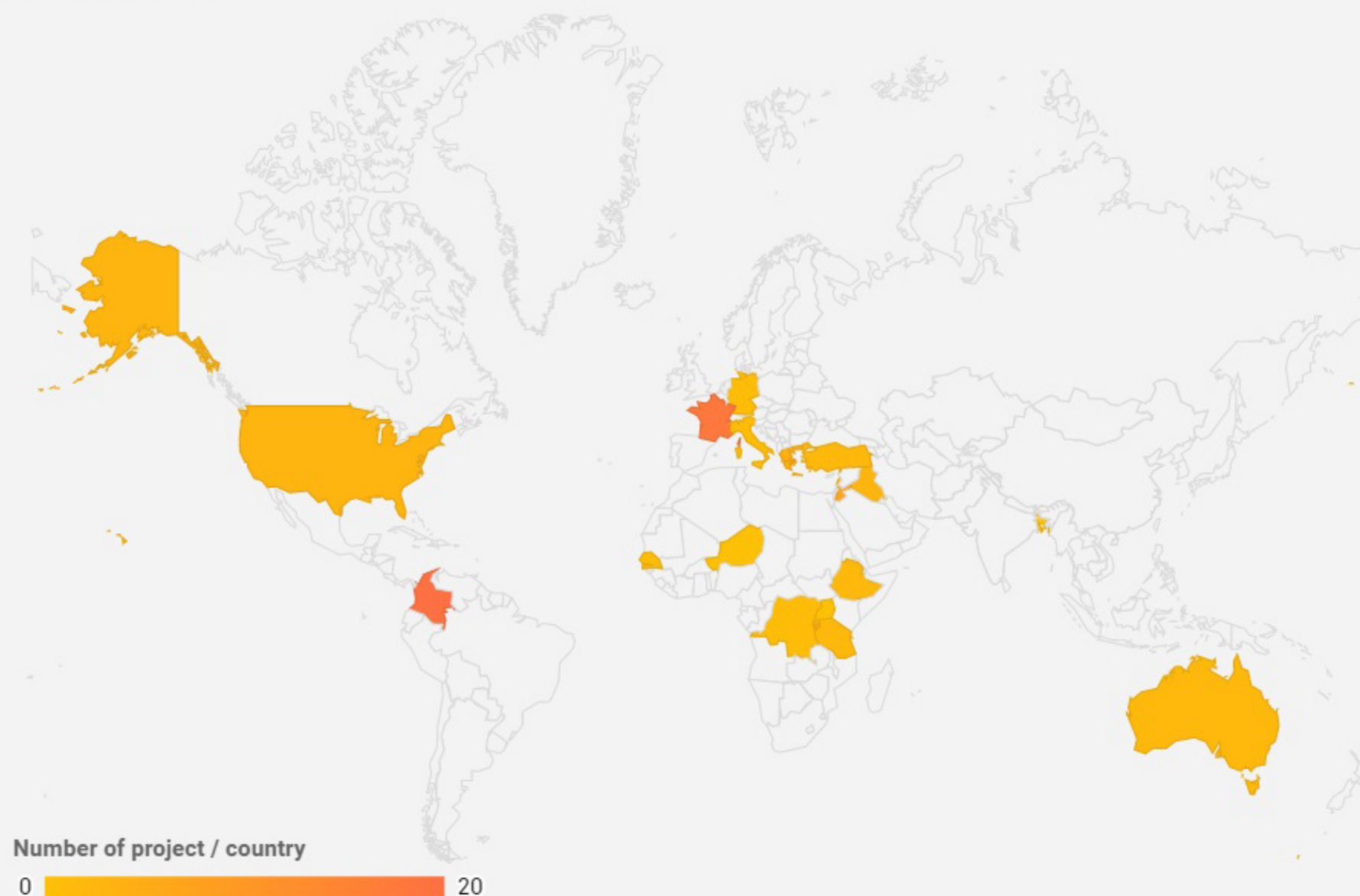
4 YEARS OF EVOLUTION

Main projects under discussion for 2018 :

- > **Jordan** : bringing the Ideas Box to 84 primary and secondary schools (Ministry of Education / World Bank)
- > **Niger** : launching 100 Ideas Box kits to provide access to public services in remote areas (Ministry of ICT, Smart Village Initiative / World Bank)
- > **Colombia** : leveraging libraries for peace-building efforts in 150 villages
- > **Bangladesh** : conducting assessments to determine impact of operating an Ideas Box program in Rohingya refugee communities
- > **Uganda** : extending the Ideas Box initiative to serve refugees in Ugandan camps

1 ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Qualitative and quantitative evaluations demonstrate that the Ideas Box has a positive impact on the academic performance of children and youth in refugee and IDP camps, as well as in rural and urban settings in low to middle and high income countries around the world. It offers a safe and stable environment where children from all walks of life can feed their curiosity and engage in creative activities.

Coursera

By partnering with Coursera, we provided **refugees in Burundi with access to university coursework**. The 1st cohort of 15 students graduated in November 2017.

Academic Achievement in Non-Emergency or Post-Conflict Contexts

30%

30% of the students who participated in the Ideas Box winter school in Detroit **increased their math test scores** after 2 weeks in the program.**

Non-Traditional Outreach Spaces

In Detroit, there are few public spaces where educational programs can take place. To address this reality, we leveraged the dynamic nature of the Ideas Box to transform non-traditional spaces into places where children and adults could learn a variety of topics and skills.

2 SOCIAL SKILLS

PEACE-BUILDING & SELF-RELIANCE



An external evaluation of our Ideas Box program in Colombia demonstrated a positive impact on the social skills of participants in peace-building contexts

+26%

Ideas Box **increases** participation in collective activities by 26%.

+15%

Ideas Box **increases** conflict resolution by 15% among adults.

+31%

Ideas Box **strengthens** youth leadership by 31% & bolsters positive feelings about the future by 20%.

+26%

Ideas Box **increases** community cohesion by 26% among teenagers.

RESILIENCE AND CONTROL OF POST-TRAUMATIC DISORDERS

"The Ideas Box meets refugee needs and starts a process of recovery from their traumatic state. It enhances resilience to overcome their stress and apprehensions to plan for the future."

A SAFE SPACE FOR PEACE-BUILDING

The Box allows for many refugees to calm post-conflict anger and violence and therefore can act as a social regulator. The Box is a "home" where the tensions, fears and torments from the outside world do not penetrate.

INFORMATION SECURITY

Refugees have access to verified information through the Ideas Box, from computers or tablets connected to the Internet as well as from peer-lead debates and information sessions. It appears as an effective instrument to fight against misinformation.

3 BRIDGING THE INFORMATION GAP

Assessments show that Ideas Box creates "information bridges" between traditional educational and informational players and vulnerable populations, in particular in remote locations or when social barriers are strong.

Libraries outreach

By bringing libraries in places familiar to people, Ideas Box is a **bridge between existing libraries and remote or vulnerable population***. On a territory like Sarcelles in Paris suburbs, 70% of the population who attended Ideas Box activities never have visited the library before.

Essential skills

Ideas Box **multiplies the traditional impacts of libraries by addressing highly vulnerable populations**. It empowers population by increasing their essential skills as reading and writing, numeracy, digital literacy, expression, etc**.

Creating local hubs

Ideas Box creates local hub where partners work together to address the need of the territory. **It connects players that usually do not work together.**



TRANSFORMING PROFESSIONAL PRACTICES AND REINVENTING PUBLIC SERVICES

The Ideas Box does not only offer new services to final users, it is a great lever for the transformation of professional practices, the prefiguration of new services and the reinvention of the way of thinking public services in the 21st century*.

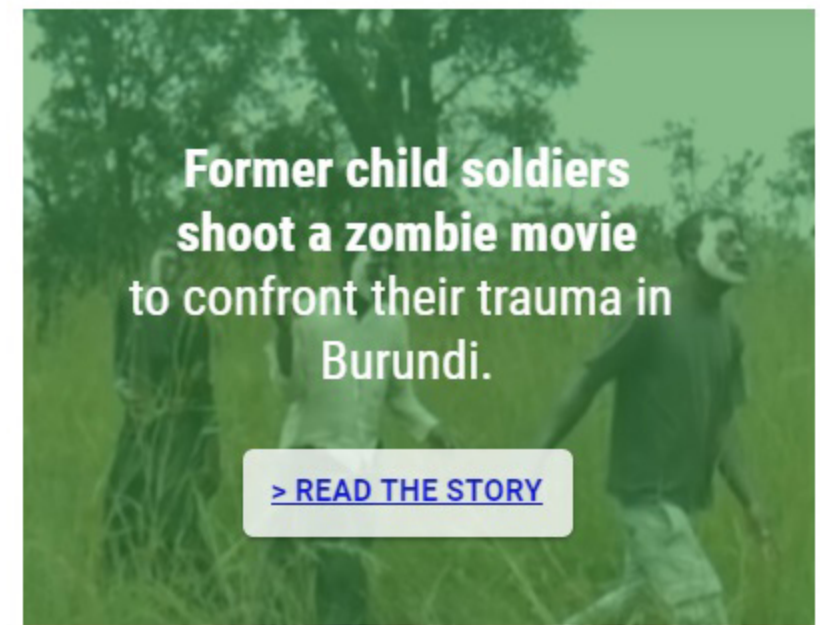
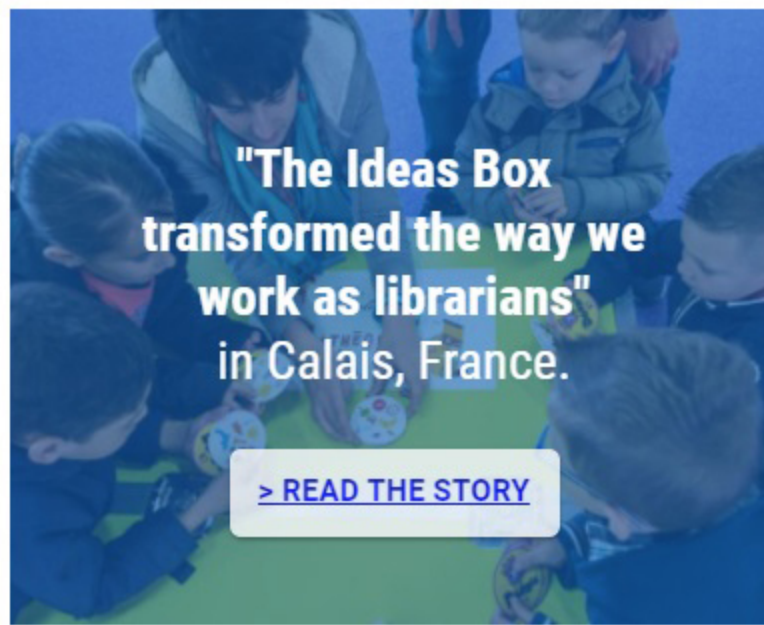

SCALE-UP

1.000 Ideas Box for 5M+ people by 2022

1. Scale-up strategy focuses on 2 directions :

VERTICAL	HORIZONTAL
Intensification of existing programs and field of intervention with multiplication of projects (Southern Europe, France, MENA, Great Lake, Colombia, etc.)	Opening of new fields of intervention (Bangladesh, Central Africa, Western Africa, etc.)

2. Scale-up strategy also relies on state-wide partnerships with governments and agencies to increase impact and efficiency of projects.



SCALE-DEEP

Toward a global community of practice

1. Develop the contents and activities database in order to support the implementation of new activities inside the box (health, entrepreneurship, employment, civic engagement, legal literacy, digital literacy, etc.)

2. Creation of a multilingual e-learning platform for the community of managers and facilitators around the world.

3. Design of a chatbot for off-field support, maintenance and data collection.

4. Instigation of a consortium of EdTech and libraries to develop a global standard for internet offline apps and contents.

5. Build passive data collection services inside the Ideas Box to ease monitoring and evaluation.



ECONOMIC MODELS

Creating sustainable and scalable models

In 2017, BSF deeply refined the Ideas Box economic and operating models in order to make it more sustainable and scalable.

The 3 main models are :

1. Partnerships with government and local authorities (through direct sale, service contract or leasing).
2. Shared services model in refugee camps for which the Ideas Box acts as a hub for NGO that pay as they use the service.
3. Partnerships with NGO (through grants) with co-creation of projects and co-management of the Ideas Box.
